## The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International Alpha Sigma January 9, 2016



The Alpha Sigma Chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met at the Lubbock Women's Club on January 9, 2016. The meeting was called to order at 10:00 A.M. by President Gencie Houy. President Houy welcomed those present and recognized a very distinguished visitor, Nancy Newton, Past State President.

President Houy led the group in an ice breaker. President Houy read the statement "Students should be able to ban a teacher if he or she does not teach well". Those present were asked to react to the statement by moving to the specified area of the room. Designations for the four areas were agree, strongly agree, disagree, strongly disagree.

### **Delta Kappa Gamma Moment:**

### Program:


The program, entitled "Have I Got a Song for You", was given by Nancy Newton, Immediate Past State President. President Newton gave the history of our Delta Kappa Gamma song that is sung at the close of each chapter meeting. The words to the song were composed by Annie Webb Blanton and Cora Martin. Although it is difficult to sing, Dr. Blanton did not want any changes made to the tune or the words. The song was first published in 1786 in Wales and was entitled "Men of Harlelch". Because Dr. Blanton was so fond of the song, she asked Ms. Viola Cole-Audet to arrange the song for women's voices. Ms.Cole-Audet was a charter member of Beta chapter in San Antonio although she lived and worked in Chicago. She illustrated the song and challenged members to figure out the lyrics that went with the illustrations. This program was a very interesting one that gave members a look at the long history of our society's song.


The meeting was adjourned at 11:10 A.M.
